The 2010 pledge to the church was \$3,000.00. The total contribution to Child Saving Institute in Omaha was \$250.00 for 2010, \$250.00 to World Outreach, \$100.00 to the Rural Iowa Crisis Center in Creston, and \$10.00 to the After-Prom party.

Cookies were furnished three times for the Bloodmobile and refreshments to JOY club five weeks in 2010. The Night Circle served cake and ice cream at the February birthday party at the Lenox Care Center; members gave a short program and gifts were given to those celebrating February birthdays. In April, CWF members provided gifts for Bingo prizes when we visited Taylor Ridge and we served sandwiches and cookies at their Halloween party.

Sandwiches and cookies were served after the February Lenten service and cookies and drinks were the refreshments following the Baccalaureate service in May. The CWF served a breakfast to honor the lone high school graduate, Evette Massey and gave her a monetary gift. Early in December, nine live poinsettia plants were delivered to homebound members and those in the Clearview and Lenox Care Centers as well as those at Taylor Ridge. Several Christmas cards, designed and made by Vina Smith, were mailed to out-of-town members and church friends.

Dinners were served to family and friends of Twila Shepherd, Ernie Hufnagel, Leonard Brown, Sandra Reed, Claudia Huntington, Monson Shaver and Dorothy Hegwood the day of their memorial service.

Income from the March pancake supper was \$459.00; the fall dinner, \$1873.00; the Stock and Saddle Club supper, \$245.00; and November soup supper, \$593.00.

The CWF held the May meeting and breakfast and the Garden Cafe in Creston. Later in May, the Night Circle plus several other CWF members enjoyed supper at the Viking Lake Restaurant. Several members attended the luncheon and program at the Lenox Methodist Church in June and a morning Tea Party and program at the Bedford Methodist Church in October. In June, we visited the Des Moines Botanical Garden and shopped at Jordan Creek Mall.

Twelve women and five men enjoyed the December pot luck dinner at the church and several carryout meals were delivered to homebound members.

After many decades, the members decided to disband the Night Circle. Karen Shawler and Judy Browning, the last Night Circle members who worked days, have retired and are attending day meetings. Hopefully, we can continue the Day Circle group for a few more years.
